1. Call to Order

Chairwoman, Cynthia McGarrah called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM.

3. Public Comment:

4. Review and Adoption of the Agenda:

District Manager, Nancy Upham asked that the agenda be adopted as is. Trustee, Barry Stewart made a motion to adopt the agenda as is. Trustee, Richard Grondin seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

5. Discussion and Approval of Minutes from February 9th, 2023:

Vice Chairman, Marion Jonte made a motion to approve the minutes from February 9th, 2023. Mr. Stewart seconded the motion it passed unanimously.

Ms. Upham stated the agenda was posted in accordance with NRS.

9. Old Business:

- 1. <u>Discussion and possible action regarding confirmation of the appointment of Kim Turner to the vacant four (4) year Board of Trustees position.</u> Legal Counsel, Joe Sanford explained that since Mr. Jonte was related to Ms. Turner he would need to abstain from the vote for clarity since the last vote could not be verified. Mr. Grondin made a motion to appoint Kim Turner to the vacant four (4) year Board of Trustee position. Mr. Stewart seconded the motion, and with Mr. Jonte abstaining from the vote, the remaining three Board Members unanimously voted in favor of the appointment.
- 2. <u>Discussion regarding the ongoing evaluation of the District Manager, Nancy Upham.</u> Mr. Sanford explained that he had only received 3 evaluations. If the new Board members were uncomfortable with assigning a score, they were welcome to add expectations for Ms. Upham moving forward in the comment sections. Mr. Sanford stated that he would proceed with whatever evaluations he received at the next meeting.

10. New Business:

1. <u>Discussion regarding the emergency declaration regarding potential flood issues from County Commissioners on March 2nd, 2023.</u> In an effort to prevent floods this summer, Churchill County signed an emergency declaration to release some of the water from Lahontan Reservoir. Mr. Sanford explained that the reservoir was currently at about half capacity but with the expected rains from the remaining winter season, it would be too much. Assistant Manager, JD MacKay elaborated that this was not counting the inevitable snow melt that is the second-highest snowpack ever recorded.</u>

Mr. Jonte asked if there were available FEMA funds. Mr. Sanford said that, yes, the County was applying for the funds but there had to be clear justification and proof of how it was applied to qualify. Mr. Jonte asked if the District would be able to apply. Ms. Upham said she would try as mosquitoes pose a very serious threat to the public. However, in some flooding situations, the water moves through quickly enough that it actually helps to mitigate the problem. She agreed that it is worth looking into.

Mr. Stewart asked how the water will be distributed. Mr. MacKay responded that the water will flow from the reservoir down the southwest side of town across the highway to the southeast of town into Carson Lake and from there it goes to the Stillwater Refuge in the northeast.

Mr. MacKay stated that it will all come down to how quickly the snowpack melts. Flooding can be controlled and managed if it is a slow melt. The actions that the County is taking will help prevent the risk of flooding in the event of a quick melt.

11. District Manager's Report and Operations Review:

Ms. Upham told the Board that five (5) technicians have been hired and trained in February. Four of them were able to attend the Mosquito Conference at the beginning of March. Most of February was spent planning for the potential flooding.

Ms. Upham stated that there may be a need for another meeting at the end of March to discuss the District's equipment needs in light of the flooding risk. Board approval is needed for any purchase greater than \$5,000.00. The Board agreed to the last Thursday, March 30th.

12. Board Member's Reports:

Mr. Grondin investigated dry ice makers for the District facility. He was able to find that one of the District's existing vendors sells liquid CO₂ cylinders. Mr. MacKay agreed that given the cost and frequency of the District's needs and purchases in the past, owning a dry ice maker makes fiscal sense. Ms. Upham will look into pricing and Mr. MacKay will look into weight and production values.

13. Any Request for Future Agenda Items:

-Mr. Jonte requested a solution for reaching Management during business hours as, at times, it has been challenging to get a hold of them.

Re: Discussion and possible action regarding the purchase of a new Backwater Performance

14-7.5 foot Airboat and trailer from Backwater Performance LLC for \$55,000.00. This airboat is a necessity and a necessary piece of equipment to be utilized in response to planned mosquito abatement treatments during a flood emergency such as this year's

potential flood status.

I realize the run-on sentence using the words "necessity" and "necessary piece of equipment" but feel very strongly that we do not currently have the right equipment to efficiently handle mosquito abatement treatments this season. We normally can use quadrunners and ARGOS to maneuver in and through swampy areas. Larger areas of deeper water would not work with the quadrunners or the backpack granular throwers as the staff would need to be walking the bank of the water body which is limiting in the amount of area breeding mosquito larvae.

For that reason, I began looking for used airboats to help alleviate the problem of extensive areas of water and inefficient ground treatment. This airboat is from a company in Orem, Utah and is the closest option and quite frankly only option that I could find. This is a new airboat with a very reliable engine made with an airplane propeller. The boat itself is able to work through water and can also be driven over land as the hull has a polymer base to it with bracing. This is not your average airboat and was specially constructed to drive through water and ice. I feel that this airboat would be an asset to the District for years to come but especially this year as we are all going to need every piece of equipment working in the most efficient way possible. This will be used in the floodwater for applications and ferrying staff from location to location. This will be used in duck clubs for treatment and can be used if future years in the v-line channel and the new v-line channel currently in the process of being constructed for mosquito and weed control This was one of the original locations that we wanted to use the drone to treat. We found that the drone would not be able to treat larger areas in the way that we had hoped. This airboat would and would be able to be utilized in our County as we are the end of the Carson River system with extensive acreage of water.


We are also having to re-evaluate our aerial component of our program as Mr. Frey is unable to fulfill his contract. We are in the process of working with another aerial program but they would need to fly their plane in from Salt Lake City and the ferrying would be factored in to the charges. Anotherwords, any aerial application of larvicides or adulticides is going to be considerably more expensive than any other years in the past.

Attached is the budget for this year. On page 5 (Schedule A-1), I have allotted \$50,000 for capital outlay. I would be using that money for this purchase instead of a new vehicle. I can budget for a new vehicle in next years budget, if need be. I realize that the purchase price is \$55,000.00 however the \$5,000.00 over the budgeted capital outlay number can be taken from

the general fund. I have also attached a sales order from Glade at Backwater Performance LLC with the specifications of the airboat. The company is holding this airboat for us for now until our Board meets to take action on such a purchase.

I understand that this is a big and unplanned investment however, I feel that time is of the essence I will prioritize driving to Utah to get it as soon as possible so that we can stay ahead of mosquito abatement treatments, as much as possible.
