#### 1. Call to Order

Chairwoman, Cynthia McGarrah called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM.

#### 2. Pledge of Allegiance:

All stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### 3. Public Comment:

None

#### 4. Review and Adoption of the Agenda:

Ms. Upham requested that the Agenda be adopted as is. Mr. Jonte made a motion to adopt the Agenda as is. Mr. Stewart seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

#### 5. Discussion and Approval of Minutes from August 10, 2023:

Ms. McGarrah requested a correction in the expenditures for the reimbursement amount of \$24,700.00 should be \$2,470.00. Mr. Jonte made a motion to approve the minutes with the suggested correction. Mr. Stewart seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

#### 6. Certificate of Posting:

Ms. Upham stated that the Agenda was posted in accordance with NRS.

- 6. August 25, 2023, Upcoming NDA Funding for Noxious Weed Control. Ms. Upham is going to apply for funding from the Nevada Department of Agriculture for \$28,000.00 towards weed control.
- 7. September 6, 2023, Weed Concerns Loreli LeBaron. This is the letter that the County sends out to private property owners for weed complaints.
- 8. September 6, 2023, Positive Mosquito Pools Laura Morrow. Ms. Upham explained that there were two (2) positive mosquito pools. The technicians have concentrated treatment efforts on those areas.
- 9. September 11, 2023, Audit Information Request Katie Dinneen.
- 10. September 13, 2023, Invasive Weed Funding Jake Dick.
- 11. September 14, 2023, Weed Concern protocol Loreli LeBaron. Ms. LeBaron wrote to Ms. Upham to explain what the protocol was when members of the public called in to complain about the weeds, either on their own property or on someone else's property.

#### 9. Old Business:

- 1. <u>Discussion regarding this season's climate reports.</u> The Board members briefly discussed their experiences of this summer compared to their perceptions of past summers.
- 2. <u>Discussion regarding birds and their competency in transmitting arboviruses.</u>
  Ms. Upham explained that birds are amplifying hosts and are susceptible to infection early on. Finding viruses in the bird population first allows the District to focus their treatments and prevent the spread to horses or humans.

3. <u>Discussion regarding diseases that are considered arboviruses more familiarly known as mosquito-borne illnesses.</u> Most of the mosquito-borne illnesses have common symptoms such as headache, fever, joint pain, and nausea. Some mosquito-borne illnesses can cause encephalitis which is the swelling of the brain or even encephalomyelitis which is swelling of the brain stem, both very dangerous situations. Ms. Upham gave a brief description of each of the arboviruses and explained that most of the viruses are transmitted by the *Culex* mosquitoes.

Mr. Jonte asked if any of the viruses affected animals and humans from the same species of mosquito. Ms. Upham responded that every one of these is zoonotic, meaning they can be transmitted from animals to people.

Ms. Upham provided the Board Members with a comparison of the District's total dry ice investment from 2022 with the current cost from 2023. When considering the purchase, travel, and technician compensation, the cost from 2022 was \$4,825. The cost of renting the tank, equipment setup, and trial and error tests for 2023 to date is \$3,465. Mr. Jonte asked if those savings would continue. Ms. Upham added that the District would return the tank for the offseason allowing for greater savings. She said that safety was not an issue as the equipment was well-ventilated and Mr. Grondin will need to be reimbursed for the scale he purchased for the District.

Ms. Upham said there was not much to report. The technicians are working hard using long-term larvicides. They have been truck fogging in the mornings and in the evenings when the weather allows.

Ms. Upham said that it seemed that this crew was more motivated and had a good handle on what was expected of them. Mr. Jonte asked if there were programs in place to retain these technicians. Ms. Upham responded that the compensation is greater than it has ever been, and they have health insurance. Mr. Jonte thanked Ms. Upham and Mr. MacKay for all that they do.

## California Arbovirus Surveillance Bulletin #29 Week 43 Friday, October 27, 2023



#### Humans

West Nile virus

A total of 15 new human cases of West Nile virus (WNV) were reported this week from 11 counties: Imperial (1), Kern (2), Kings (1), Los Angeles (2), Madera (1), Placer (1), San Bernardino (1), San Joaquin (1), San Luis Obispo (1), Stanislaus (3), and Yolo (1). This is the first WNV positive human case from Imperial County this year. In 2023, a total of 286 human cases of WNV have been reported from 32 counties. Of the 286 cases, 208 (73%) had neuroinvasive disease and 10 (3%) were fatal. The median age of the case-patients was 58 years and 181 (63%) of the case-patients were male. The dates of symptom onset ranged from June 30 to October 2. In addition to the 286 WNV human cases, 22 asymptomatic WNV-positive blood donors have been reported from 14 counties: Amador (1), Butte (1), Contra Costa (1), Fresno (2), Kern (2), Kings (2), Los Angeles (4), Orange (1), Riverside (1), San Bernardino (2), San Joaquin (1), San Mateo (1), Stanislaus (1), and Yolo (2). At this time last year, 106 WNV human cases had been reported from 21 counties.

St. Louis encephalitis virus

A total of 2 new human cases of St. Louis encephalitis virus (SLEV) were reported this week from 2 counties: Fresno (1) and Kern (1). In 2023, 8 SLEV human cases have been reported from 5 counties. At this time last year, 9 SLEV human cases had been reported from 4 counties.

#### **Dead Birds**

A total of 12 new WNV positive dead birds were reported from 4 counties: Alameda (3), Riverside (2), Sacramento (1), and Santa Clara (6). In 2023, 843 WNV positive dead birds have been reported from 31 counties. At this time last year, 185 WNV positive dead birds had been reported from 24 counties.

#### **Mosquito Pools**

West Nile virus

A total of 38 new WNV positive mosquito pools were reported from 7 counties: Contra Costa (1), Fresno (1), Los Angeles (13), Riverside (17), San Bernardino (1), Sonoma (2), and Tulare (3). In 2023, 4,424 WNV positive mosquito pools have been reported from 31 counties. At this time last year, 3,128 WNV positive mosquito pools had been reported from 26 counties.

St. Louis encephalitis virus

A total of 13 new SLEV positive mosquito pools were reported from 4 counties: Fresno (2), Kern (2), Riverside (2), and Tulare (7). In 2023, 727 SLEV positive mosquito pools have been reported from 15 counties. At this time last year, 151 SLEV positive mosquito pools had been reported from 9 counties.

#### **Sentinel Chickens**

West Nile virus

A total of 2 new WNV positive chickens were reported this week from 2 counties: Los Angeles (1) and San Benito (1). In 2023, 185 WNV positive chickens have been reported from 17 counties. At this time last year, 144 WNV positive chickens had been reported from 13 counties.

St. Louis encephalitis virus

No new SLEV positive chickens were reported this week. In 2023, 1 SLEV positive chicken has been reported from 1 county. At this time last year, no SLEV positive chickens had been reported.

### TEST PROTOCOLS

#### Humans:

Specimens are tested by local laboratories with an IgM or IgG immunofluorescent assay (IFA) and/or an IgM enzyme immunoassay (EIA). Specimens with inconclusive results are forwarded to the California Department of Public Health Viral and Rickettsial Disease Laboratory (VRDL) for further testing with a plaque reduction neutralization test (PRNT).

#### **Dead Birds**

Oral swab samples collected from bird carcasses are tested at the UC Davis Arbovirus Research and Training laboratory (DART) or at a local agency for West Nile virus by RT-qPCR.

#### Sentinel Chickens:

Dried blood spot samples from sentinel chickens are tested at the California Department of Public Health Vector-Borne Disease Laboratory for IgG antibodies to West Nile, St. Louis encephalitis, and western equine encephalomyelitis viruses by an EIA. Positive samples are confirmed by IFA, western-blot, or PRNT.

#### **Mosquito Pools:**

Mosquito pools are tested at DART or at a local agency for West Nile, western equine encephalomyelitis, and St. Louis encephalitis viral RNA using a multiplex RT-qPCR. Invasive *Aedes* mosquitoes (*Ae. aegypti* and *Ae. albopictus*) are also tested at DART for chikungunya, dengue, and Zika viral RNA by a separate RT-qPCR.

Typically in October, mosquito abatement efforts slow down. People irrigate less frequently and the temperatures drop making the evolution of the mosquito life cycle slow down, as well. This is also true with disease transmission. We continued to test for west nile virus until the end of October but the one week in September was the only week that we had any positive mosquito pools.

Staff transitioned into working with Russian knapweed applications and clearing away weeds from stop signs or other visibility concerns.

We are working with the Staff to trimming efforts down to a shorter work week while using accrued annual leave to cover the days off and extend the season so that we do not need to lay everyone off, as we have done in the past.
