Subject: Weed Clean-up Required

Dear Property Owners:

The Fire Marshal observed weeds on the subject property that constitute a potential fire hazard. Enclosed is a list of various businesses licensed to work in Churchill County that may be able to help you with the cleanup if you wish to contact any of them. According to International Fire Code Section 301.1.2 Vegetation-Weeds, grass, vines or other growth that is capable of being ignited and endangering property, shall be cut down and removed by the owner or occupant of the premises. It is recommended that you create a fire break of a 30-foot strip around the boundary of your parcel.

All deposits or accumulations of weeds are considered a dangerous condition according to Churchill County Code Title 8 Health & Safety.

Please <u>contact the Public Works</u>, <u>Planning & Zoning Department at (775) 423-7627 by May 20, 2022</u>, to discuss this situation and determine which is the best course of action for you to pursue to address this concern in a timely manner.

Question about the safety of joggers:

There was a couple of questions that came up from our WALS presentation. One was about joggers and the particles from a WALS application. Attached and below is the response that Carolina sent me when I asked this question.

Hi Chris,

Thank you for reaching out with this question. There is plenty of information about the use of Bacillus thuringiensis that gives us confidence about its safety to humans. I am including information obtained from the World Health Organization, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the U.S. National Pesticide Information Center. All these organizations have published their own assessments showing that products based on Bacillus thuringiensis are safe to humans. I have prepared a simple document, attached, in which all the original content from these institutions has been extracted, to answer your specific question, and also I have included the corresponding source and link to the full technical page or document in which these studies were communicated to the public. Please find the pdf document attached and browse through each source and their conclusions on Bacillus thuringiensis safety. I hope this helps.

In addition to the information by WHO, EPA and NPC, our own narrative is below:

Should I be concerned and what should I do if a VectoBac WDG wide area spray program is conducted in or over my neighborhood?

There is nothing harmful or toxic in VectoBac WDG; it is gluten-free, egg-free, and nutfree. It won't affect you, your family, or your pets. The VectoBac spray deposit may show as very small droplets on outside surfaces of your home and your vehicle.

The spray deposit will not affect your home and garden, outdoor furniture, or your vehicles. If you have any medical issues, we suggest that you consult your medical doctor and if you are still concerned or feel nervous for any reason, stay inside during the short time that your property/neighborhood is being treated. Spraying is conducted early in the day, before most residents have started their day, and it happens quickly; many residents aren't even aware of it.

Is Bti safe?

Bti has undergone nearly 40 years of lab/field research and over 30 years of large-scale operational use in a variety of public health programs around the globe. Bti is very targetspecific with activity largely restricted to mosquitoes and related flies (in the sub-order Nematocera of the order Diptera).

In addition to Bti's nontoxicity to beneficial insects, numerous toxicology studies have shown Bti to be non-pathogenic and non-toxic to other forms of wildlife (birds, fish, mammals, etc.) and humans. The World Health Organization has approved the use of Bti for drinking water. This is particularly important in many regions around the globe that depend on potable water or rainwater stored in vessels in and around their home. Unfortunately, these vessels are often prime locations for mosquito vectors of Zika virus to lay their eggs. The same species of mosquito also transmits the diseases dengue, chikungunya, and yellow fever.

Is there a temperature threshold (minimum/maximum) for WALS applications? Here is the standard recommendations for environmental conditions:

Environmental Conditions

KEEP THE SPRAY CLOUD NEAR THE GROUND (NOT DRIFTING UPWARDS) Effective swath coverage is entirely dependent upon wind conditions. Winds between 1 and 15 mph are recommended to achieve adequate spray distribution

Applications in completely calm conditions (no wind) will not yield acceptable results.

These conditions occur most often in the night and cool morning hours, after an inversion develops and when atmospheric mixing (turbulence) is low. Temperature inversions cause the air closest to the ground to become cooler than the air above.

Why is temperature inversion needed for WALS application?

To make sure the droplets are not drifting upwards which usually happens when there is no inversion. Districts usually spray throughout the night and/or early morning hours.
